

TOWN OF SILVER CREEK
CASTLE DANGER SUBORDINATE SERVICE DISTRICT MEETING
March 3, 2015

The Castle Danger Subordinate Service District meeting of The Town Board was held on Tuesday, March 3, 2015 at the Town Hall. Present were Supervisors – Mike Hoops, Greg Hull, Larry Lampart; Clerk – Frederick R. Whitney (absent); Deputy Clerk – Kristina Pirsig; Constituent –Leroger Lind.

Hoops called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

CONSTITUENTS CONCERNS:

Hoops updated LeRoger Lind regarding the presentation by Odyssey to the County Board regarding the purchase of John's Breezy Point in Larsmont. Discussion was held regarding the Land Use of Commercial zoning and Resort Commercial.

Leroger asked about if there was any educational material to hand out to new land owners in Silver Creek Township to educate them about Land Use and Sewer. Hoops explained that there isn't anything in place right now and the board doesn't have any plans on creating something.

Leroger inquired about the Blanchard property and their intentions with the property. Hoops explained that they might possibly have a buyer for the back portion and are looking at making an easement to the beach.

WASTEWATER OPERATOR'S QUARTERLY REPORT: March 3, 2015

December – Received 0.3161 million gallons of influent

January - Received 0.3323 million gallons of influent

February – Received 0.2984 million gallons of influent

The district received 27,300 gallons of trucked in wastewater during this same period.

A new pump was received about 2 weeks ago and installed in #2 lift station. We do now have a spare should the need arise to use it. If financially possible the district should continue with the plan to replace these original pumps.

The cold weather and no snow have resulted in many service calls for frozen pumps as well as a couple frozen discharge lines. Heaters have been installed where needed and kept freeze-ups from re-occurring. We do have a couple of frozen lines that have the pumps out and wastewater is pumped as needed.

As discussed earlier with the board a major line failure occurred at the Dorothy Peters' residence in January. The break was repaired in a timely fashion and all reports filed with MPCA.

Ponds are much lower at this time than they were a year ago. With a good spring startup we should be able to reduce the amount of water carried over even further.

We are having a minor glitch in the exercise mode on the auto start for the generators. In a power failure they are starting and shifting the load correctly. It is unknown if this is a cold weather/electronics problem or wiring. It is still being researched by the installer.

There has been no movement on the part of Rustic Inn to install a grease interceptor nor has there been any contact with Eric Blasing, our engineer for the district.

All monthly reports and sampling were done and submitted to MPCA in a timely fashion.
